D Hook

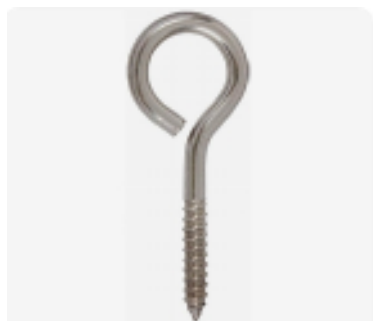


V Hook

Example:



D Hooks or V Hooks with approximately 1" opening (or larger). One hook positioned on each side (must 2 hooks or more) on the back of the piece approximately 1/3 of the way down from the top.



Eye Hook

Eye Hook inside Frame



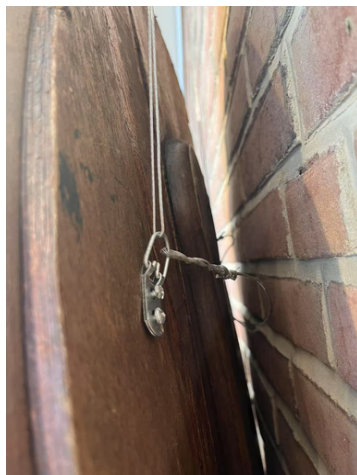
Eye Hook on top/face of Frame

Position 1/3 of the way down from the top. Eye hooks can be positioned on the inside of the back of the frame/stretched canvas frame or on the face of the back of the frame (must 2 hooks or more). The picture wire should be tight (no slack).

Acceptable Museum Hanging Method



Hi-Holder + V/D/Eye hook + Hanging Wire



Picture Rail Molding Hook + V/D/hook + Hanging Wire



Hi-/Long Holder + Hanging Wire/Fishing Line

Unacceptable Museum Hanging Methods

(but not limited to)

Sawtooth Hangers



Plastic, Metal, or Wood Holes/Channels



Anything that puts holes in walls!
